## FINDING 1985 MOVE VIDEOS

Click on the TOP link, right above Cabrini College ad, and you will see a list of items potential videos that come up. They are organized by time of day, starting at 6 a.m. It will give you a list, and you can select. To select the video, click on the tiny symbol below the page.

Particularly interesting segments: 6:30 a.m. short clip on the 1978 confrontation; 7:00 am compare/contrast comments from Terry Ruggles; 5:00 pm recaps the days events; 5:27 pm and 5:37 pm are around the time of the "charge" dropping from the helicopter. Segments after chronicle the growing fire, which grows substantially after about 6:00 pm.
